

Announcement of Mahidol University Guidelines for Organizing Activities in Mahidol University Following the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) Outbreak during Festive and Holiday Season

Reference is made to Mahidol University's Annoucement dated the 19<sup>th</sup> December 2020 on the Guideline for Students and University Personnel on Working from Home to Respond to the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-2019) Outbreak in Samut Sakhon Province by advising those residing in the province to refrain from travelling outside of the area until the 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2021.

Mahidol University is announcing herewith additional measures for organizing activities in all areas within Mahidol University to prevent the outbreak of the COVID-19 during the festive and holiday season following the guidelines of the Department of Disease Control, Ministry of Public Health. Vice Presidents supervising all campuses and division in the Office of the President and Heads of Faculties/Institutes/Colleges are to observe the following measures:

- 1. Academic and non-academic activities in convened in public within the university areas, the organizers are to ensure that:
  - 1.1 the number of participants is not overwhelmingly crowded; or not exceeding 50 percent of the available space; or appropriately spaced around 1 person per 1 square meter;
  - 1.2 participants are grouped into a small size and there are enough walking and utility spaces to implement social distancing; and
  - 1.3 all participants observe social distancing measures, wear masks at all times and scan in/out using Thaichana application.

2. If participants attending the event appear to have symptoms of the COVID-19 afterwards, it is advisable that the Risk Management Centre, Mahidol University is to be notified soonest at Tel: 02-849-6150 and 02-849-6154.
